CLUB TRIAL: SUNDAY MORNING, MARCH 10, 2024

Our first event of the season is a Club Trial. We'll start around 9 a.m. and go as long as necessary to finish with all the dogs that come. Full details will be provided next month (including a location; we are still up in the air about this). Briefly, club trials are kind of a cross between an actual AKC-sponsored field event and a training day. We set up courses that can be adapted to the training level of the dog, from Junior up through Master, and our judges for the event are usually AKC judges that can provide some advice and assistance on you and your dog. We normally use Dokkens but sometimes people bring a few frozen ducks that we can use as well. It's a good tune up for the hunt test season, particularly to see if your young dog is ready to go!

AKC MASTER ONLY HUNT TEST: SATURDAY—SUNDAY, APRIL 13-14, 2024

This test will tentatively be held at the Lucky 7 Ranch in Sweetwater. Judges will be Mike Perry and Wes Bowman. Entries open Wednesday, March 20 (a day earlier for Amateurs and worker-code set-asides) at 8:00 p.m. ET. This will be a single flight with 66 entries. Full details next month.

AKC MASTER ONLY HUNT TEST: TUESDAY—WEDNESDAY, MAY 14-15, 2024

This test will be at Brian Caldwell's farm, State Highway 58S, Georgetown, TN. Single flight only, 66 entries. Judges are not finalized yet, we're working on it! Entries will open April 24, 2024 at 8:00 p.m. ET (again, on Tuesday for Amateurs and people with worker codes).

AKC QUAD JH—SH HUNT TEST: SATURDAY—SUNDAY, JUNE 1-2, 2024

To be held at the Hiwassee WMA, Birchwood Tennessee. There will be two Junior and two Senior stakes each day; an opportunity to finish up a title in one weekend. Judges still to be determined.

AKC MASTER ONLY HUNT TEST: TUESDAY—WEDNESDAY, JUNE 10-11, 2024

This test will be at Brian Caldwell's farm, State Highway 58S, Georgetown, TN. Single flight only, 66 entries. Judges will be Jack Gravely & Linc Huffman. Opens May 22, 2024 at 8:00 p.m. ET (Tuesday, May 23 for Amateurs and people with worker codes).

We have more tests and other events planned in the fall, after a summer break until September. All of these events need volunteers to help plan and work these events. You can participate with your dog and still work — good fun, free lunch and other food, good companionship. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact J. Intermediate Skills Building Workshop

This seminar is now open for registration for everyone, ETRC members and non members. We had five members express interest in attending, and the Board voted to sponsor them in the amount of \$500 for a handling slot, and \$250 for an auditing slot. The four who have eventually decided to go are Denise Chambers and Karen Edwards (auditing slots), and Jim Pearce and Cade Chambers (handling slots).

Regular tuition is \$750 per dog/owner team, and \$400 per person auditing the seminar. These costs are inclusive and cover all Kevin's expenses, grounds fee, and provision of all equipment needed for the seminar as well as 2 workers for setup and bird tech work for all three days. The price also includes one dinner for all participants on Saturday night. Limited lodging (cabins) is available onsite at the retreat, and people wishing to stay can contact Lois directly for details and bookings. Lodging is also available in Crossville about 20 minutes away. The workshop starts at 8 a.m. Central each morning and goes till about 4:30 in the afternoon. Kevin doesn't stop the seminar for lunch, so participants would need to bring their own bagged lunches — plus a chair, gear for their dog, rain gear, etc.

The workshop is focused on Intermediate Skills building, and is designed for handlers who are through basics and ready to begin transition to the upper levels. Kevin will take up to 9 owner / dog teams and an unlimited number of auditors without dogs. Drills, skill development and confidence building; the mechanics of marking development, marking concepts, fighting the factors that will influence the dog's ability to make the retrieve, and more will be covered

Kevin Cheff (www.theretrievercoach.com) has over 27 years of experience in training and handling dogs in hunt tests and field trials, both professionally and as an amateur. He has put Hunting Retriever Champion titles, Field Champion titles, and National Retriever Champion titles on numerous dogs. He is know for his in-depth knowledge, great communication skills, an abundance of patience and a passion for teaching.

If you are interested in attending, please contact Lois right away and let her know whether you are interested in a working slot or an auditing slot.
