Another of our big Spring Extravaganzas for Junior and Senior dogs is in the books! This is an increasingly popular test, giving people the opportunity to earn a title all in one weekend. It's so popular that other clubs are planning to copy our format — I hope they have a hundred workers because this is one tough test to put on for sure, with four tests running at once each day and multiple handlers entered with different dogs in all 4 at once. Two days of chaos, but it all went off very well and we were super lucky that the weather wasn't too hot. Saturday was perfect. Of course, we could have done without the monsoon on Sunday; several guys ended up wearing swimming trunks and there were a lot of thoroughly drenched people and dogs! Several people with frog togs came to the Cabin and still emptied out about 1/4 cup of water from each shoe or boot.

There were two Junior and two Senior tests each day, four tests in total at each level. Thanks a bunch to our ETRC member Judges Dick Lamping, Haley Shealy, Lisa Vencille, and especially to Lois Luthenauer who filled in when one of the scheduled judges had to cancel two days before the test after coming down with Covid. Thanks also to our non-member judges — Ray Rogers, Bonnie Cuddihy, Robert Shell and Kenny Wilburn West. Judges have to work harder than anyone!

We had 285 total entries, gave out 36 title ribbons and 132 orange completion ribbons. Numbers were in the mid-40s for each of the 4 Junior tests, and upper 20s for the Senior tests. That's a lot of dogs! Thanks to our bird technicians, who were a combination of kids from the Cleveland State Community College Wildlife Society, ETRC members who worked long hours in the sun and rain, and some professional techs from around the area. That's a hard job, hand throwing ducks all day long, for sure. Thanks also to the marshals, the set-up crew, the duck wranglers, the lunch makers, and everyone else who helped put on this event. ETRC Hunt Test Report June 11-12, 2024 Midweek Master, Lucky 7 Ranch

Our fourth hunt test of the season, and the third Master Only test, was held June 11-12 at Ken Campbell's beautiful Lucky 7 Ranch in Sweetwater. We were again super lucky with the weather, the high was about 82 on Tuesday and only slightly higher on Wednesday before starting more than a week of 90 plus temps and blazing sun! This is our last hunt test till the fall, and I think it's safe to say that we are all heaving a sigh of relief and looking forward to some time off. It's fun, but it IS work!

Thanks to our judges, Linc Huffman and Jack Gravely, to the professional bird techs supplied by pro trainers Barry Smith and Ryan Stamey, to the club members who filled in on the third gunner station off and on all test, to the many members who served in a variety of jobs including hunt test secretary, site marshal, duck wrangler, helped set up and take down equipment, fixed lunches, ran errands, and more. It truly takes a village! Mike Smith, you are still missed even though we did have several newer members who came and worked like Trojans. Finally, thanks to everyone who competed with your dogs.

Test description:

- Land Series: laid out on the hilly land near the second technical pond, this first series included a walk-up triple with a blind under the arc of the second bird. The third (go) bird was at the bottom of steep hill. Many of the dogs carried so much speed they ran up the other side and hunted high. The 1st bird down was fairly short and off to right. The 2nd bird, which was usually picked up last, was also at the bottom of the hill on a slant. Many dogs did lots of hunting and there were many handles. The blind was along the treeline after running down a slant and then up again. Decoys were planted along the path of blind and also in front of the shortest mark. Difficulty not only included the hilly terrain but also changing shadows as the day progressed. 61 dogs were entered, and one scratched leaving 60 to come to the line.
- 2. **Water Series:** The second series was a water triple with honor. All three marks involved a swim and finding the mark on the hill beyond the bank. Difficulties included the terrain, crossing a gravel road on one mark, and high cover in spots on the bank. 49 dogs came to the line in this series.
- 3. Land-Water Series: The third series involved a triple, with two of the marks land marks and the third one with a swim, plus a bland blind and a water blind and a diversion shot. 45 dogs returned for the final series, which took an average of around 6 minutes to complete. The judges warned the contestants that many were 'bleeding badly' and needed to do a stellar job on this series. The final number qualifying was 33.
