

# ETRC Quadruple JH/SH AKC Hunt Test June 1-2, 2024, Hiwassee

This is our big Spring Extravaganza for Junior and Senior dogs, with the opportunity to earn a title all in one weekend! There will be two Junior and two Senior tests each day, four tests in total at each level. Junior Judges on Saturday, June 1 are: Dick Lamping & Haley Shealy (Junior 1) and Clint Catledge & Ray Rogers (Junior 2). Senior Judges on Saturday are Lisa Vencille & Bonnie Cuddihy (Senior 1) and Robert Shell & Kenny West (Senior 2). On Sunday, June 2, the same judges will have the following assignments: Junior 1 is Vencille & Cuddihy; Junior 2 is Shell & West; Senior 1 is Lamping & Shealy, and Senior 2 is Shell & West.

The test is closed with mid-thirties entries in all four Junior events, and mid-teens in the senior events. Check Entry Express for the premium list and further details. There are no limits on the number of entries. We will have a mix of professional and club member/ wildlife society bird technicians and a bagged lunch will be provided to all workers at the test. Completion ribbons and title ribbons will be awarded, along with duck bands. There will be no live flyers, as this property is a 'no live ammunition' site as approved by AKC.

Volunteers are needed to help out with test set-up and breakdown, bird technicians, and running errands. With 4 setups running at once each day at a large test site, the normal 3 or 4 people who help out will NOT BE ENOUGH. Call or text J. Michael Evans at 865-824-8638 to sign up. Just a few hours on even one day will be a big help! Free bagged lunch will be provided to all volunteers who stay till lunchtime or come early for the afternoon session.

# ETRC Midweek Master Only AKC Hunt Test June 11-12, 2024, Lucky 7 Ranch, Sweetwater

This is our third Master Only hunt test of the year, and will be back again at the fabulous Lucky 7 Ranch. The test opened May 22, and closes on June 3. We have a full test with a waiting list at the present time. Check Entry Express for the premium list and further details.

We will have professional bird technicians and a bagged lunch will be provided to all workers at the test. Completion ribbons and title ribbons will be awarded, along with duck bands. There will be no live flyers, as this property is a 'no live ammunition' site as approved by AKC.

**DIRECTIONS TO LUCKY 7 FARM:** The address is, 6720 Erie Road, Sweetwater, TN. BE AWARE that some GPS services may take you to the wrong place, around the back of the farm where there is no entrance. Alternatively, use the address 6979 Erie Road, which is right across the street from the L7 Farm entrance.

NOTE: New members, or people looking to get into the hunt test game, are encouraged to come and spectate at one or both of these tests. Single flight Master tests are easy tests to watch, since there is only one set up at a time and plenty of room to set up a chair and watch. With this many Junior and Senior tests on the June 1-2 Quad test, you will have a great opportunity to study how these tests are run.

# ETRC Hunt Test Report May 14-15, 2024 Midweek Master, Brian Caldwell's Farm

Our second hunt test of the season was held May 14-15 over at Brian Caldwell's in Georgetown, Tennessee. Although the forecast was for rain and thunderstorms both days, we didn't get hit with anything torrential and the test moved right along. The first two series were finished by the time we closed down for the evening on Tuesday, and the third series was done and the ribbon ceremony completed just before 1:00 on Wednesday. Temps were lovely, in the 60s and low 70s.

We had a full test — 66 dogs signed up, 5 scratched before the test began, and we were able to re-fill the scratched dogs from the waiting list. So, 66 dogs came to the line for the first series; 46 for the second series, and 43 for the third. 31 dogs passed.

Thanks to our judges, Keith Maready and Robbie Griffin. Special thanks to Brian Caldwell for the use of his farm / training grounds and to Bob Smith for arranging for 4 terrific professional bird technicians. Bob Smith's arm, in particular, is a thing of beauty with ducks landing in exactly the same spot time after time! Thanks as always to Beuttner Farms for the really lovely ducks and to Cory Smith for keeping them at his farm for a few days in the duck pen over there.





Other members helping out on one or both days or during setup — Mike Evans, Alan Bruhin, Jim Pearce, Donna Smith, Bob Smith, Hunt Test Secretary and Marshal Michele Fletcher, David Knott, and Melissa Dobson. Karen Edwards made a cameo appearance on Wednesday to pay the bills, missing in action the rest of the time because of out of town guests. Also missing in action was Mike Smith, who decided to blow out his knee instead. What an excuse! Finally, thanks to everyone who competed with your dogs.

**Test description:** (Thanks to J. Michael Evans for this information)

1. **Land Series:** Triple mark, double blind with an honor. First mark on the left thrown right to left into light cover (approximately 115 yards). Second mark was thrown right to left down a tree line into thick cover (approximately 75 yards) and the third mark was thrown left to right, uphill into light cover (approximately 65 yards). The left-hand blind was on the backside of gunner station #1 (approximately 150 yards), and the second blind ran on the

backside of gunner station #3 (approximately 70 yards).

- 2. **Land-Water Series**: The second series was a triple with a walk-up. The first mark (walk-up bird) was splashed to the left (approximately 40 yards). The second and third marks were a mom and pop thrown on land into light cover (each approximately 55-65 yards) and between mowed strips.
- **3. Water Series:** The final series was a triple with a blind and a diversion shot. The first mark was thrown down the levee from the left approximately 45 yards: the dog had to cut the corner on the pond. The second mark thrown was straight away approximately 75 yards, thrown right to left where the dog had to cut across the small island and reenter the water to get to the bird in thick cover near the shoreline. The third mark was to the right, thrown down a point approximately 65 yards where the dog had to enter the water, cut the corner of a point, re-enter the water and exit onto the next point. The dog received a diversion shot returning from this mark. The blind was on the backside of station #2 and the dog had to cut across small island and swim a "down the shore" line without getting out onto the point to retrieve the duck laying in the corner. This test had increased difficulty due to swimming geese, goslings and mallards that were loose in the pond.


### NEW FIELD TRIAL CHAMPION: FC AFC SEASIDES TROUBLESOME FOWL PURSUITS

## Get Well Soon, Mike!



### TWO NEW OUTSTANDING DAMS

The Golden Retriever Club of America (GRCA) awards Outstanding Sire (OS) and Outstanding Dam (OD) titles to those dogs whose progeny have earned a certain number of high-level titles. To be named as an Outstanding Dam, a bitch must have at least 3 "qualifying get". To be a qualifying get in the field world, the puppy must have at least a Senior Hunter title; in Obedience they must have a Utility title; in Agility, an Agility Excellent is required, and in Scent Work, the minimum title needed to be a qualifying get is a Scent Work Master title. Conformation titles are also qualifying at the Champion level. Once a puppy has become qualified towards earning its dam the OD title, other lesser titles in one of the other fields also counts towards the overall point total which must be met for a Dam to qualify. The two new Outstanding Dams in ETRC are:



MACH RPO's Calamity Jane UD SH MXG MJS MXF MFS T2B3 OD "Callie", owned and loved by Michele Fletcher. Callie had one litter of 5 puppies, all of whom are out competing successfully.

Her qualifying get are:

- Calamity Jane's Special Brew JH MXB MJB MXF T2B (Chai), 13 points
- 2. Calamity Jane's Ricochet of Agilitypaws MX AXJ MXF T2BRATO RS-N JS-E GS-O (Ricochet), 9 points
- RPO's Calamity Jane's Sidekick CDX BN R1 AX OAJ NF CGC (Kick), 13 points
- Calamity Jane's Flower Child AX AXJ XF (Groovy), 9 points

Her fifth puppy, Watermark Don't Go Trippin Over Me (Tripp), has a Junior Hunter title and a CGC, so may join her list of qualifiers one of these days.


